



**List of Questions Received for
Request for Bids #2023-SA-9100
Partners in Policymaking Curriculum Project**

1. What intellectual property rights would the grantee maintain over the materials? Would the grantee be able to share the resources publicly free of cost?

Answer: The Council's contract with the selected bidder will include specific provisions related to sponsorship, logo, copyrights, and data collection that may be negotiated, including allowable provisions for the Contractor to use information from the Contract for publication. The Council has approved provisions on a case-by-case basis for Contractors to pursue copyright of selected publications and wide use of publications free of cost.

2. Could we add additional curriculum evaluation steps to the materials, such as focus groups with self advocates?

Answer: Any consideration of additional curriculum evaluation steps beyond those required by this Request for Bids would be determined by the Council, the Council's evaluation consultant, and the Contractor post-contract award to the selected bidder.

3. Can the grantee update, reorder, or alter the curriculum for accessibility reasons or factual accuracy in consultation with the FDDC?

Answer: In consultation with FDDC, the grantee may update or alter the curriculum for accessibility reasons or due to factual accuracy. The ordering of the curriculum must follow the order provided in the Florida PIP program schedule, Appendix B of this Request for Bids, pages 11 and 12.

4. Would this curriculum be used in an integrated environment alongside the regular PiP curriculum, or whether there would be a separate PiP class for people who need the curriculum?

Answer: This curriculum will support in-class participation in the integrated environment alongside the regular PIP curriculum with the exception of breakout sessions denoted with an “*” in Appendix B of this Request for Bids, pages 11 and 12, and possible pre-class preparation and after class homework and follow up.

5. You ask for the final files in an editable format. What specifically does that mean? We format our files in InDesign to make them more accessible, which isn't possible in Word. Would that meet the requirement?

Answer: Yes, InDesign would meet the requirements.
