



Examples of Potential Conflicts of Interest

All Council Members will have associations with other organizations that may lead to a potential Conflict of Interest. In order to help identify potential conflicts of interest, Council Members complete forms.



Potential Conflicts of Interest for Consideration for Council Member Opportunities Examples



Board Member of
organization who receives
funding from Council

You must resign from either the Council
or as a Board Member of an organization
that is funded by the Council.

Paid by an organization
who receives funding from
Council

You must resign from the Council

Council Member role with information that has not been made public such as programmatic ideas or dollars that would be made available

The Council serves as a public governmental entity under Florida Sunshine

When information has been made public, it can be shared

If shared, recuse yourself from any decisions made so no appearance of undue influence

You must not share any information prior to it being made public to avoid appearance of an indirect conflict/benefit

Non-Disclosure/Confidentiality Agreement signed with the Council

Appointed Member from

Avoid Standing Committee that
makes policy or funding
decisions for state or federally

Disclose any direct or indirect

(Executive)

Disclose any direct or indirect conflicts you may
have with the Council

Update Council Non-Disclosure/ Confidentiality
and Conflict of Interest forms

Appointed to Council as person with DD (self-advocate), a family member of someone with DD, representative of provider agency and/or agency that serves persons with DD and my role is as an advocate or spokesperson (Officer, on a committee, Lobbyist, or part of legislative affairs/public policy)

Council members must represent the best interests of the Council as a whole and refrain from promoting any personal or professional interests

Avoid situations where you are wearing several hats and the listener will not be able to differentiate who you are representing (especially, if you are representing another advocacy organization or as a Lobbyist).

Avoid being an Officer of the Council, unless you resign from any other role with any organization/board/committee directly funded by the Council

Avoid chairing any Standing Committee
